

# How can the National Library of Scotland support your heritage project?

- The National Library of Scotland is the biggest library in Scotland, and one of the largest research libraries in Europe. We collect a copy of everything published in the UK and Ireland, and archives and books from all periods of history. The Library collections also include film, maps, newspapers and magazines, and sound recordings. Whatever your project, we should have something here to interest you and to support your research. The National Library is a reference library, so it's not possible to borrow books, but you can use the Reading Rooms and get remote access to many digital resources once you have a Library Card.
- Our website contains web features and online exhibitions on a range of topics. You can access these free of charge, without having a Library Card.
